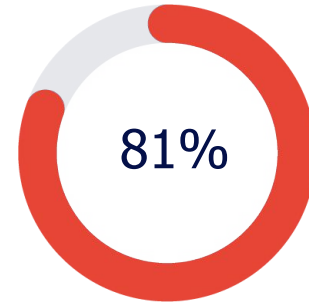

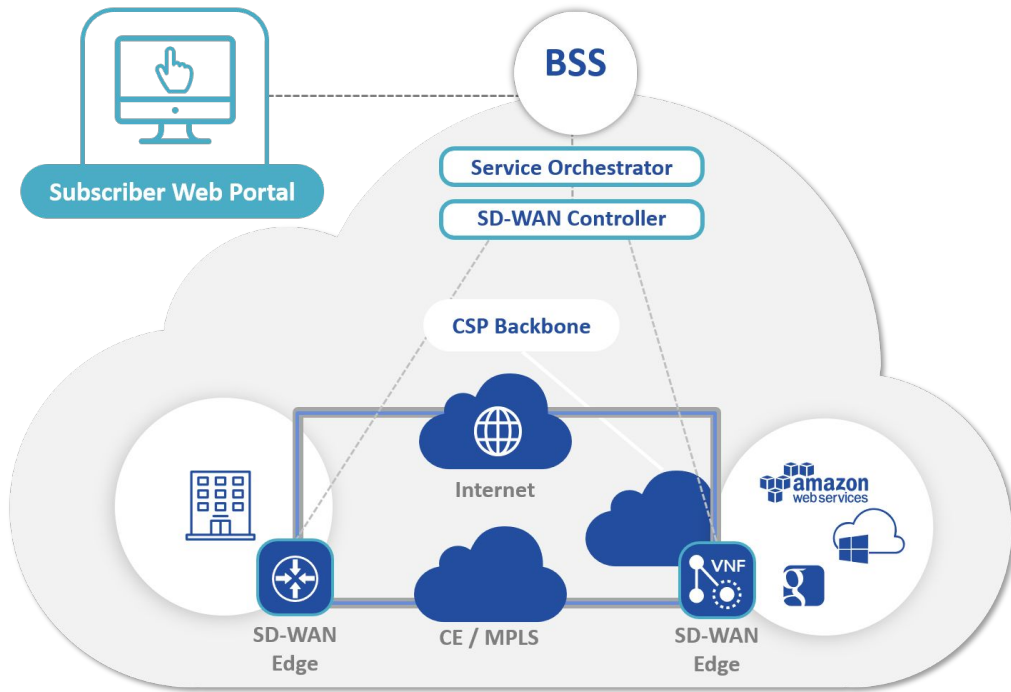

why are companies struggling to get started?

typical root cause(s)

mitigation options



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we're struggling with organizational buy-in.

typical root cause(s)

- sunk investments
- "if it's not broken, don't fix it"
- lack of trust with the security of SD-WAN
- company avoids "newer" technologies
- lack business justification

mitigation options

- resale options on equipment
- sound business case
- plan with milestones
- thorough test plan
- strategic discussion vs. tactical one



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- lack of resources with skill sets
- afraid or nervous to learn or recommend new technologies
- fear of job security

- supplement the team with SD-WAN engineers; upskill existing talent



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we don't know when to make the move.

- lack of experience with technology

- if the following applies to your firm, it's likely time to move to SD-WAN.
 - maintenance costs are getting too high
 - over 50% of applications are already in the cloud



why do SD-WAN implementations not go as planned?

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- pilot was not properly sponsored
- pilot did not have a finite timeline, metrics or exit criteria

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our deployment is always behind schedule.

- lack of capacity
- often the same resources are utilized for this special project, as well as BAU
- perhaps lack of skill set

- dedicate resources or a partner to the SD-WAN project and also dedicate resources or a partner to BAU



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we have had unexpected business and production impact.

- may lack standardized PMO and governance processes
- change control not followed religiously

- develop proper governance framework
- maintain current change control procedures



why do companies not realize the full benefits of SD-WAN?

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why do companies not realize the full benefits of SD-WAN?

what clients are telling us

we're not realizing the expected cost savings.

typical root cause(s)

- circuits are often not decommissioned
- remaining value of decommissioned equipment not recognized
- internet circuits available quicker than readiness of sites

mitigation options

- circuit turnoff needs to be a milestone in the plan
- potential resale of removed equipment
- adjust planning considerations to shorten project schedule

- not maintaining features and updates as part of a regular O&M process
- implemented unproven technology pairings

- keep current on patches
- lean on experts

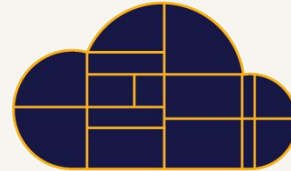
